Folliculitis is defined histologically as the presence of inflammatory cells within the wall and opening of a hair follicle, creating a follicular-based pustule. The actual type of inflammatory cells can vary and may be dependent on the etiology of the folliculitis, the stage at which the biopsy specimen was obtained, and the site of both.

Drug-Induced Acne (Acneiform Eruption): Drug-induced acne accounts for approximately 1% of all drug-induced skin reactions. 5 Pustular eruptions are typically observed on the face and upper trunk. Comedones are not commonly documented with this type of outbreak. The eruption occurs 1-2 weeks after the causative agent is initiated.

Irritant contact dermatitis. Irritant contact dermatitis (ICD) is the most common occupational and home-related dermatosis.³ ICD is a form of exogenous eczema caused by direct physical or chemical irritation. Seborrheic dermatitis is an inflammatory skin disease characterized by flaky, red, or yellowish scales that resemble dandruff. Sometimes, the scales may itch or even crust and ooze. Seborrheic dermatitis affects people of all ages. It keeps recurring, i.e., it goes away for a while and comes back again. However, it most commonly affects adults between ages 30 to 60 and infants under 3 months of age.

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
