In phonetics and phonology, free variation is an alternative pronunciation of a word (or of a phoneme in a word) that doesn't affect the word's meaning. Free variation is "free" in the sense that it doesn't result in a different word. As William B. McGregor observes, "Absolutely free variation is rare.

Sources of Variation in First Language Acquisition ...

The phonological acquisition of a young girl whose parents spoke two dialects of Cantonese was examined. The father's dialect had a phonological distinction between initial /l/ and /n/ which was merged into /l/ in the mother's dialect. The child was followed bi-weekly for approximately one year.
