Alfred Jarry (French: [al.fʁɛd
ʒa.ʁi]; 8 September 1873 – 1

November 1907) was a French symbolist writer who is best known for his play *Ubu Roi* (1896), a pataphysical work which depicts the bourgeoisie as the super-mediocre. He coined the term and philosophical concept of pataphysics, which uses absurd irony to portray symbolic truths (and playfully vice versa).
