All Too Human takes as its point of departure the early 20th-century nudes of Walter Sickert RA, whose uningratiating tastelessness seems extraordinary for its time. One of the reasons Bacon and Freud failed to reach a wider audience in Britain in the 1960s and 1970s was that they were seen by many as being in bad taste.

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
