

Book Of Five Gathas

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The Gathas; The Sublime Book of Zarathustra; New ...
The Yasna recitation has 72 chapters. The Ha's are identified by their numberings as chapters of the Yasna. There are five major sections of the 17 Ha's of the Gathas listed here: 1. Ahunavaiti, consisting of Ha's 28-34 of the Yasna, containing 100 verses.

The Gathas The Hymns of Zarathushtra
The most important portion of the Yasna texts are the five Gathas, consisting of seventeen hymns attributed to Zoroaster himself. These hymns, together with five other short Old Avestan texts that are also part of the Yasna, are in the Old (or 'Gathic') Avestan language.

The five Gathas address a wide variety of information, which include, the creation of Nature, the concepts of Asha, Vohu Manah and the Twin Spirits, the choices that mankind has to make between Good and Evil, the expected outcome for the demons of the time, the punishment for the followers of falsehood, and a slew of other material.

Book Of Five Gathas
Book of FIVE GATHAS The word Gatha means "a song", and is derived from Avesta root g? "to sing". The Gathas are recited as prayers, one on each of the five Gatha days, which occur at the end of the Parsi calendar year. The seventeen chapters of Gathas are included in the seventy-two chapters of the larger text of Yasna.

The Gathas - The Hymns of Zarathushtra
In extent the Gathas constitute a small book containing about 6000 words, in about 1300 lines set in 238 verses which are collected in 17 chapters, each called a Haiti, or in the more usual later term, HA. The 17 Ha's of the Gathas were, some time later, incorporated into a long prayer, or liturgy, recited at a ceremony.

The religion is believed to have influenced many of other world religions, including Christianity. For example, the story of creating the world in seven days is told in Avesta - one of the texts that predate The Bible. Several parallels can also be traced between another text called the Gathas of Zarathushtra Yasna and the Book of Isaiah. Zoroastrianism is also responsible for the angels and demons hierarchy and notions of Heaven and Hell.

The Zoroastrian holy book is called the Avesta. This includes the original words of their founder Zarathushtra, preserved in a series of five hymns, called the Gathas. The latter represent the basic source of the religion.

The Gathas (/ ? ? ?? t ? z,-t ?? z /) are 17 Avestan hymns believed to have been composed by Zarathushtra (Zoroaster) himself. They form the core of the Zoroastrian liturgy (the Yasna). They are arranged in five different modes or metres.

Gâsân or Gâhân is the plural form and in Pahlavi and Zoroastrian Persian, it always means the "five Gathas" and nothing else. Bâr in Pahlavi and Persian means "occasion, time, turn." The Persian name for the festival is Gâhânbâr, the turn (to turn to) the Gathas.
