When tiny Folkways Records, the label for which Seeger started recording in 1950, issued Broadside Ballads, Vol. 1 through its Broadside Records subsidiary, among the various artists performing songs that had been featured in the topical song magazine Broadside was one "Blind Boy Grunt," who sang Dylan songs and bore a suspicious vocal similarity to the songwriter, suggesting this was just a pseudonym adopted for contractual reasons.
