Charlotte Salomon (April 16, 1917 – October 10, 1943) was a German-Jewish artist born in Berlin. She is primarily remembered as the creator of an autobiographical series of paintings *Leben? oder Theater?: Ein Singspiel* (Life? or Theater?: A Song-play) consisting of 769 individual works painted between 1941 and 1943 in the south of France, while Salomon was in hiding from the Nazis.

Charlotte Salomon was born in Berlin in 1917, the daughter of a cultured Jewish surgeon. When she was nine years old her mother committed suicide, and when she was twelve her father took Paulinka, a famous opera singer and the daughter of a cantor, as his second wife.

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The Obsessive Art and Great Confession of Charlotte Salomon

The show featured the work of Charlotte Salomon, who died at Auschwitz in 1943. She was 26 when they gassed her, five months pregnant with her first child. Born in Berlin in 1917, she had dreamt of being an artist, brought up by cultured Jewish parents to be musical, creative, confident in her aesthetics, thoroughly middle class.

Charlotte Salomon (1917-1943) was a painter from Berlin who fled Nazi Germany in 1939 and

spent the last years of her life at her grandparents' home in the south of France. Her grandmother's suicide led Charlotte to paint a dramatized autobiography in an extensive series of gouaches.

As Griselda Pollock writes in *Charlotte Salomon and the Theatre of Memory*, the acts of imagining and of painting became "a way of deflecting such a death". Salomon's grandfather only revealed to her the true extent of her family's history of mental illness after her grandmother's suicide, but even before the Nazis upended her genteel life in Berlin, she was already fighting for her ...

Charlotte Salomon: Life? or Theatre? – Riot Material

Or Theatre? Charlotte Salomon was 22 years of age when she fled from Berlin and arrived at her grandparents' home in the South of France as a refugee in December 1938. When her grandmother committed suicide following the outbreak of the Second World War, Charlotte embarked on a 'totally wild project' to ward off mental disintegration.
