The Christ of Culture The first two views Niebuhr portrays are quite polarized. Over and against those who embrace the Christ against culture ethic are those who espouse the Christ of culture ethic. This ethic is not "against" culture, nor does it "reject" culture. Rather, it is in "agreement" (41) with culture.
