A jury trial (or trial by jury) is a legal proceeding in which a jury either makes a decision or makes findings of fact which are then applied by a judge. The U.S. Constitution recognizes the right to jury trial as a civil right which gives the accused an option in choosing whether to be judged by judges or a jury.

Jury Trials In Civil Cases Rule 38, Fed. R. Civ. P., recognizes the Seventh Amendment right to trial by jury, and provides for demand of jury; but, failing such a demand, jury trial is waived. See also Rule 39, and 28 U.S.C. §§ 1861 to 1874. Government suits for money are commonly tried to a jury, if demanded.
