**INTERIM GUIDANCE FOR CHILD CARE AND DAY CAMP PROGRAMS ...**

*This guidance builds upon the Alberta Health Services Health and Safety Childcare Guidelines, which all child care operators are required to follow. All re-opened licensed child care centres will also be required to be in compliance with applicable zoning and health and safety legislation, including the Child Care Licensing Act and Child Care Licensing Regulation.*
