## **Down Syndrome & Alzheimer's Disease Link: Risk Factors**

There is a common platform of seizure-related cognitive decline in both Alzheimer's disease (AD) in the general population as well as in Down syndrome (DS) but the association has been studied more in AD. Cognitive impairment appears to be greater in AD patients in the general population with seizures compared to those without seizures [ 1 ].

Yes, it appears that people with Down syndrome are at greater risk for developing Alzheimer's disease. According to the Down Syndrome Society, Alzheimer's disease is diagnosed in about 30 percent of people with Down syndrome in their 50s and in about 50 percent of those in their 60s.

A key challenge to adults with Down syndrome (DS) as they age is an increased risk for cognitive decline, dementia, and Alzheimer disease (AD). In DS persons ranging from 40-49 years of age, 5.7-55% may be clinically demented and between 50-59 years, dementia prevalence ranges from 4-55% (reviewed in [ 1 ]).

## **Alzheimer's Disease in Down Syndrome**

Estimates suggest that 25% or more of individuals with Down syndrome over age 35 show the signs and symptoms of Alzheimer's-type dementia. The percentage increases with age. The incidence of Alzheimer's disease in people with Down syndrome is estimated to be three to five times greater than that of the general population.
