Appropriate Instructional Practice Guidelines for Physical ...

Developmentally appropriate practice refers to a mode of education that focuses on the child as a developing human being and a constant learner. In this approach a child is seen as an active member in the learning process. The program has five characteristics. First, the program is aimed at social, emotional and cognitive development.

12 Principles of Developmentally Appropriate Practice 1. All domains, or areas, of development and learning are important. These include physical, social and emotional, cognitive (or thinking) and language domains. What happens in one domain affects the others.

For example, when we are figuring out what is appropriate for each individual child, we have to take into account the goals and values of the family. If you put these words together, the term developmentally appropriate practice means individualized, responsive care that is just right for the child's age, cultural context, and personality.

Big Ideas Developmentally appropriate practice means teaching and creating learning opportunities to match where children are in their development and understanding, in other words, learning opportunities that are appropriate to their stage of development.
