Manet displayed the painting instead at the Salon des Refuses, an alternative salon established by those who had been refused entry to the official one. Like his friend Courbet, Manet influenced modern painting not only by his use of realistic subject matter but also by his challenge to the three-dimensional perspectivalism established in Renaissance painting.

As a child, his father was a judge, who wanted him to pursue a career in law, but his uncle, recognizing little Edouard's talents, encouraged his interest in art, often taking him the Louvre.

Manet's presentation of contemporary figures and subjects realized the call of writer Charles Baudelaire, who in his 1859 essay, "The Painter of Modern Life," asked for an art of modern life, modern subjects and a modernization of classical subject matter, such as the nude. Notably, Manet based the figures in the foreground on people he knew.

Édouard Manet was a French modernist painter. He was one of the first 19th-century artists to paint modern life, and a pivotal figure in the transition from Realism to Impressionism. Born into an upper-class household with strong political connections, Manet rejected the future originally envisioned for him, and became engrossed in the world of painting. His early masterworks, *The Luncheon on the Grass* and *Olympia*, both 1863, caused great controversy and served as rallying points ...

In this commanding image of the great French artist, Fantin portrayed Manet not as a painter, but as a flaneur, a sophisticated man-about-town whose eyes are open to every nuance of modern life. The background of the painting is almost completely blank, both in homage to works by Manet and in emulation of photographic portraits of the period.
