Pottery - Pottery - Stoneware: The stoneware (Steinzeug) came mainly from the Rhineland and, in particular from Cologne, Westerwald, Siegburg, and Raeren (the latter now in Belgium). Manufacture probably began in Cologne about 1540. The body of the stoneware is extremely hard and varies from almost white (Siegburg) to bluish gray (Westerwald); a brown glaze over a drab body is also to be seen ...

Porcelain pottery was made from a nonabsorbent, hard white clay found only in China at the time, until Europeans figured out a formula of their own during the early 18th century.
