Ergonomic items are eligible for reimbursement with a Letter of Medical Necessity (LMN) with a flexible spending account (FSA), health savings account (HSA) or a health reimbursement arrangement (HRA). Ergonomic items are not eligible with a limited care flexible spending account (LCFSA) or a dependent care flexible spending account (DCFSA).
