In the book of Jeremiah, God told the people that he would exile them from the land for 70 years, because this was the amount of time that the Sabbath rest had been disobeyed (490 years total). Here in Ezra, we see that this 70 year period had elapsed, as Daniel had also anticipated (Dan. 9:1-2).

As a result of their disobedience, the Israelites spent 40 years wandering in the desert before they entered Canaan. 1406 BC Moses died and Joshua took over. Finally the Israelites invaded Canaan.

The Babylonian captivity or Babylonian exile is the period in Jewish history during which a number of people from the ancient Kingdom of Judah were captives in Babylonia. After the Battle of Carchemish in 605 BCE, King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon besieged Jerusalem, resulting in tribute being paid by King Jehoiakim. Jehoiakim refused to pay tribute in Nebuchadnezzar's fourth year, which led to another siege in Nebuchadnezzar's seventh year, culminating with the death of Jehoiakim and the exile to
