Feeding challenges can include food refusal, food sensitivities, fear of swallowing (phagophobia), difficulty swallowing (dysphagia), "failure to thrive," and others. A child's oral motor, sensory and communication skills may have an impact. As a result, many "behaviors" may also be expressed during mealtime.

In a second, systematic review of clinical swallowing and feeding assessments for use with pediatric populations, not just children with cerebral palsy, authors identified 30 assessments that are published or described in the literature as clinical, pediatric swallowing and feeding assessments (Heckathorn et al., 2016).
