

Graph Paper Cardinal Direction Activity

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Activity: Cartography and Your Bedroom - GK-12

- Cardinal Directions – One of the four principal directions on a compass: north, south, east, or west.
- Compass – An instrument that uses a magnetized metal bar to indicate the direction of the earth's magnetic poles.
- GPS or Global Positioning System – This is a system that allows anyone with a receiver to determine their location.

Activity to be done in Partner Groups
1. Teacher passes out one sheet of graph paper to a group of 2 students or one sheet to each student.
2. Partners write the four cardinal directions on the graph paper in the correct areas.

longitude and latitude activity on graph paper | Teaching ...

Have students orient and label their blank piece of graph paper to match the cardinal (north, south, east, west) directions of their volcano. Have students draw the visible layer(s) of the volcano to scale on the graph paper using a ruler and colored pencils. Discuss that there is much detail that can't be seen from the surface.
