Dental Clinical Criteria and Documentation Requirements

If you have advanced periodontitis, treatment may require dental surgery, such as: Flap surgery (pocket reduction surgery). Your periodontist makes tiny incisions in your gum so that a section of gum tissue can be lifted back, exposing the roots for more effective scaling and root planing.

Dental cleaning includes scaling, which is the mechanical removal of plaque and calculus from the teeth around the gum line. For patients who develop periodontitis, a more extensive procedure called scaling and root planing (SRP) is performed.

Prophylaxis - limited to a total of one prophylaxis or periodontal maintenance procedure (considered under "Periodontal Services") in any 6 consecutive month period. Allowance includes scaling and polishing procedures to remove coronal plaque, calculus, and stains. - Adult prophylaxis covered age 14 and older.
