Determinants of health are the biological, environmental, behavioral, organizational, political and social factors that contribute either positively or negatively to the health status of individuals, groups and communities.

Identifying Patients with Social Determinants of Health. SDOH determine 80-90 percent of patient outcomes, according to the National Academy of Medicine. Knowing this, care teams will only be able to successfully help patients when they are able to identify and address these hidden SDOH.

Social Determinants of Health: The Impact on Members ...

This reflects the fact that outcomes such as morbidity can produce a change in a determinant or risk factor. For example, childhood illness can be responsible for lower educational attainment. In this case, the definitions of outcomes and determinants are reversed; morbidity would be the determinant or factor and educational attainment the outcome.

Goals & Outcomes

Social determinants of health are the conditions in which people are born, grow, live, work and age.¹ They include factors like socioeconomic status, education, neighborhood and physical environment, employment, and social support networks, as well as access to health care (Figure 1).

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
