It is an innovative volume that recalls the earlier tradition of textbooks of comparative philology, which, however, exclusively treated Indo-European languages.

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These include the Semitic languages (now recognized as a branch of the Afro-Asiatic family), which was discovered and named by Friedrich von Schläzer in 1781, and Dravidian, suggested by Francis W. Ellis in 1816, but proved to be a valid genetic family in 1856 by Robert A. Caldwell.

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
