The medical term for this common complication is known as posterior capsule opacification (PCO). This happens when the back of the lens capsule - the part of the lens that wasn't removed during surgery and that now supports the lens implant - becomes cloudy and impairs your vision.

Brown-McLean Syndrome (BMS) describes a condition in which the peripheral (2-3mm) inferior cornea become edematous and progresses circumferentially, sparing the central cornea in most cases.1-2 First described in 19691 as "peripheral corneal edema after cataract extraction," it was later renamed to Brown-McLean syndrome.3

Modern cataract surgery has evolved into a remarkably brief operation with very few complications. When complications do occur, however, they may be classified into three categories by time of occurrence: intraoperative, early postoperative (first few days), or late postoperative (several weeks or months later).

Phacoemulsification for Cataracts - procedure, recovery ...

Severe cataract surgery complications resulting in blindness are very rare (less than 0.1%). Cataract surgery complications can occur during surgery itself, within a few days/weeks of surgery, or months after surgery. Often, these complications occur not because of anything you have or have not done.

Spontaneous iris bleeding during cataract surgery in a ...

Rarely, complications of cataract surgery may arise, including posterior capsular opacity or tears. Other complications include posterior vitreous detachment and toxic anterior segment syndrome. Most ophthalmologists agree that one of the most common complications of cataract surgery is something called posterior capsular opacity.

What are the Most Common Complications of Cataract Surgery?

Cataract Surgery complications and problems after Cataract removal are generally pretty rare and are usually less than 5% in an otherwise healthy group of patients. In patients with additional eye diseases such as Glaucoma or Diabetic Retinopathy the complication rate may increase.

Phacoemulsification has taken the previous risks from cataract surgery, making it a much safer procedure. Before phacoemulsification, death after cataract surgery was still rare, but usually stemmed from the possible complications of general anesthesia.
