Components of the multiple lift rigging assembly shall be specifically designed and assembled with a maximum capacity for total assembly and for each individual attachment point. This capacity, certified by the manufacturer or a qualified rigger, shall be based on the manufacturer's safety factor for all components.

Factors to be considered when planning lifting operation include the following: a) Identification of lifting operations to be performed and load characteristics e.g. weight, center of gravity, stability, and physical size. b) Making ample allowances for unknown factors, and determine the available capacity of the equipment being used.
