Manorial Records are held by many archives and record offices, often within landed family and estate collections. They are protected under the Law of Property Amendment Act 1924, to ensure their preservation. There are many different types of manorial record, and they range in date from the 12th century until the 1920s.

Manorial records provide more information about community interests and the lives of ordinary people from the 13th-16th centuries than any other contemporary source. Special Collections holds a significant number of manorial documents. While not an exhaustive list, they can be found in the following collections:

### **Manorial Documents Register - Archive**

Manorial records include court rolls, surveys, maps, terriers and all other documents relating to the boundaries, franchises, wastes, customs or courts of a manor. We are co-ordinating an ongoing programme

to revise, update and computerise our paper-based Manorial Documents Register on a county by county basis, working in collaboration with external partners.

So manorial records can tell us about other buildings on the estate, as well as the main house. Don't expect detailed information though. Medieval records tend to give tantalising glimpses rather than full descriptions. In the Middle Ages land ownership was tied to national security.

Records of honour courts are manorial and are included in the Manorial Documents Register. An honour is an administrative unit based on a number of manors, the tenants of which owed suit to an honour court in addition to, or in place of, the normal manor court.

These records shed vivid light on past local communities, as manorial courts combined the functions of a local 'parliament', a small claims court and a land registry, and their records give rare glimpses of the lives of ordinary men and women, particularly in the 15th to 18th centuries.

### **Types of manorial record - The University of Nottingham**

A further difficulty with manorial records is that, except for the 1650s, the rolls are in highly abbreviated Latin until 1733. While a basic knowledge of Latin is an ideal starting point, it is possible through self-tuition to translate most of the material contained in the rolls.
