A typical quotation is enclosed in double quotation marks and is part of a sentence within a paragraph of your paper. However, if you want to quote more than four lines of prose (or three lines of verse) from a source, you should format the excerpt as a block quotation, rather than as a regular quotation within the text of a paragraph.

The first line of the excerpt should not be further indented, unless you are quoting multiple paragraphs—in which case the first line of each quoted paragraph should be further indented 0.25 inches. As should the rest of your paper, a block quotation in MLA style should be double-spaced.

Do not use two question marks. Use only the question mark contained in the quotation: Which Shakespeare character asked, "Is this a dagger which I see before me, / The handle toward my hand?" But if the sentence includes a parenthetical citation, place the question mark after the citation: How would you respond to the writer's question, "How important is punctuation" (5)?
