The Tetragrammaton was translated into Greek (in the septuagint) as "kyrios" or "lord," just the same as "adonay." So, you won't find any "LORD" in the New Testament ...

The New Testament is one of the most attested ancient works in existence. The Journal of Biblical Literature Vol. 87 p.184 has listed 5,255 known New Testament Greek fragments. The Tetragrammaton does not appear in the New

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Testament either as YHWH or as the Greek transliterations PIPI, YAW and Iabe in a single one of these ancient New Testament manuscripts.
