The margin of safety in steam sterilization is sufficiently large that there is minimal infection risk associated with items in a load that show spore growth, especially if the item was properly cleaned and the temperature was achieved (e.g., as shown by acceptable chemical indicator or temperature chart).

Guidelines for sterilization and sanitation . Non-disposable devices and instruments must be first scrubbed in hot water and soap, and then sterilized in an autoclave. Acetate stencils, if used, must be sterilized using an antibacterial solution after each use.

Guideline for Disinfection and Sterilization in Healthcare ...

Sterilization of bulk liquids requires special care to prevent the containers from exploding. Do not autoclave bulk liquids without following the manufacturer's written instructions. Each gallon of infectious liquid must be autoclaved for one hour at 121 °C at 15 pounds per square inch.

Sterilizing Practices | Disinfection & Sterilization ...

A Since sterilization of instruments is not an employee health issue, OSHA does not provide guidance for sterilization. However, since used burs are a contaminated sharp, employees must wear the appropriate personal protective equipment when handling them after patient care.

FAQ's Sterilization - OSAP

OSHA will keep all identities confidential. Exercise their rights under the law without retaliation, including reporting an injury or raising health and safety concerns with their employer or OSHA. If a worker has been retaliated against for using their rights, they must file a complaint with OSHA as soon as possible, but no later than 30 days.
