Living with Sprit Sails. If you have a boom, you need a little block of wood on the bottom with a bee hole in it, set at a distance from the boom jaws that ' s equal to the length of the sail luff. For a boomed spritsail the brail is run through the bee hole on the boom, not a grommet on the leech, and gathers up both boom and sprit.
