People who use more than one drug, which is very common, need treatment for all of the substances they use. Opioids: Methadone (Dolophine ® , Methadose ®), buprenorphine (Suboxone ® , Subutex ® , Probuphine ® , Sublocade ™), and naltrexone (Vivitrol ®) are used to treat opioid addiction.
