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Inanna - Sumerian Goddess of The Ancient World

In her astral aspect, Inana/Ištar is symbolized by the eight-pointed star. The colours red and carnelian, and the cooler blue and lapis lazuli, were also used to symbolise the goddess, perhaps to highlight her female and male aspects respectively (Barret 2007: 27). Name and Spellings. Inana/Inanna is the Sumerian name of this goddess.

Ereshkigal plays a very prominent and important role in two particular myths. Inanna's Descent into the Underworld. The first myth featuring Ereshkigal is described in the ancient Sumerian epic poem of "Inanna's Descent to the Underworld." In the poem, the goddess, Inanna descends into the Underworld, apparently seeking to extend her powers there.
