Seating area: 1930 sq. ft. Space per seat: 12.4 sq. ft. Row spacing: 4' 0" Most distant seat: 35' 0" Stage elevation: 12' Floor design: Risers, 12' Example of wide fan . 3/4 arena: This form is typically used for open space theaters and is based on the continental seating arrangement.
